Did you know?

Article 28 of the United Nation Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) says that children and young people have the right to education no matter who they are: regardless of race, gender or disability.

Did you know?

- 14% absence for your child each year would equal 1 full year of school missed by the end of P7
- 25% absence each year would equal 1 full year of school missed by the end of P4.
- 30% absence each year would equal 2 full years missed by the end of P7
