This term your child will be learning to:

Numeracy & Mathematics

Number

- subtract 2-digit numbers from 2-digit numbers using written and mental methods
- add 2-digit numbers using the column method
- multiply 1-digit numbers by 2, 3, 4 and 5
- use a tables fact to find a division fact, with and without remainders
- partition 3-digit numbers
- learn the 3 X table by heart

Outer Maths (e.g. Shape, Measure, Time etc.)

- use analogue and digital clocks to show minutes past and minutes to
- convert between digital and analogue time
- place events of a day into a timetable
- find durations in weeks or days
- read a simple 12-hr timetable
- use a variety of digital timers to measure time

Expressive Arts

Music & Drama

- participate in a whole-school show
- explore the use of character in small-group role play
- listen to and explore a range of instruments and follow simple rhythms and notations
- listen to, and discuss, different styles of music

Art & Design

- use a variety of techniques to create artwork linked to topic

Modern languages

French

- revise the numbers to 50, days and months
- speak about our likes and dislikes
- say words related to Easter
- use French words for animals and to describe them

RME

- extend our knowledge of world religions by exploring special places and artefacts

Technology (incl. ICT)

- create a simple slideshow presentation
- research information using the internet

Literacy & English

Reading

- scan texts for key information and make notes
- use higher-order thinking skills to answer, analyse and evaluate question
- explore new vocabulary through the class novel
- find synonyms and antonyms
- use a dictionary and thesaurus

Writing

- take notes and use these to create new texts
- create a fact file
- write diary entries
- begin to use joined writing in a variety of contexts
- use bullet points appropriately
- use commas in lists
- use apostrophes

Listening and Talking

- deliver a clear and logical presentation on an aspect of the Egyptian topic in pairs
- learn and recite a Scottish poem

Social Studies

- use map skills to locate continents and countries
- understand the importance of the River Nile now and in the past
- compare aspects of people's daily lives in the past with my own, using historical evidence

Health & Wellbeing

- further develop levels of fitness
- create and teach a simple ceilidh dance
- explain why imported food has an impact on our carbon footprint
- identify the Fairtrade logo and Fairtrade products sold in shops
- explore the benefits to our environment of shopping locally
- explore the different ways that adverts and the media can affect food choices
