



## Clermiston Primary School Term 4 - Primary 4/5

This term your child will be learning to:

### Numeracy & Mathematics

#### Counting

- 8 x tables
- Doubling 3 digit numbers crossing 10
- Multiplying whole numbers by 10 and 100
- Understanding 2 decimal place numbers

#### Calculation

- Combine two or more table facts to solve division by 2 3 4 5 (with and without remainders)
- Solve  $3d + 3d$  as money and  $3d - 3d$  as money

#### Column methods

- Division of 4 digit by 1 digit

#### Wider Maths

- Drawing lines to the nearest half cm
- Perimeter
- Measuring and converting l and ml
- Showing a variety of equivalent fractions
- Rounding numbers to 2 decimal places

### Expressive Arts

#### Art and Design

- Use a range of drawing implements to produce specific effects e.g. tone and line variation
- Inspired by the jungle, creating images with a concept of depth (showing foreground, middle ground and background)

#### Music

- Use voice, instruments and technology to make and experiment with music (with a jungle theme)

### PE

- Participate in 2 PE lesson per week, choosing from Mrs Griffin's weekly lessons or using Joe Wicks PE lessons on YouTube
- Play or go for a walk to get at least 1 hour of physical activity a day

### Literacy & English

#### Reading

- We will continue to read The Wild Robot by Peter Brown as our class novel
- Select texts regularly for enjoyment or to find information for a specific purpose (e.g. topic research)
- Explain preferences for particular texts, authors or sources.
- Apply a range of skills and strategies to read and understand texts with a focus on skimming and scanning

#### Writing

- Make notes to help plan writing and use them to create new texts
- Organise important information in written texts using headings, bullet points, captions or titles.
- Use paragraphs to separate thoughts and ideas
- Create texts for a range of purposes, selecting appropriate style, format and layout
- Makes appropriate choices about layout and presentation to engage the reader
- Reviews and corrects writing to ensure it makes sense

The following outcomes will be covered through our Jungle theme:

#### Science

- Classify animals to appreciate the diversity of our planet
- Relate physical and behavioural characteristics to their survival or extinction.

#### Social Studies

- Discuss the impact of humans on the environment
- Suggests ways we can live in a more environmentally responsible way

### Useful info for grown-ups:

- This is such an unusual term so the information above represents what we hope might be possible and enjoyable to do at home. Please do not feel any pressure, do what suits you and your child. You do not need to plan any additional teaching to achieve these outcomes. If pupils do not learn everything above this term, we will cover it again when we are back at school. Do what you can.
