Dropping Off and Collecting Your Child

Nursery Session Times

Monday to Thursday: 8.30 am – 3.00pm Friday: 8.30-12.30

- In the morning, please bring your child into nursery and register them by putting up their snack card. We operate a soft start so you are welcome to stay and play for a short time.
- At pick up, please wait outside the front entrance, where a member of staff will bring out the children and will sign them out.
- Your child must be brought to nursery and collected by a responsible adult over 16 years of age.
- If someone different will be collecting your child, please speak to a member of staff. A child cannot leave with someone else unless the nursery has been informed in advance.
- Please try to avoid ringing the nursery bell at other times above as it can interrupt the children's learning.

Communication

Your Contact Details

Please ensure your **contact details are always up-to-date** in case we need to contact you about your child. We ask you to complete an 'admission form' for your child when they first start at nursery and again at the start of the new session in August. You will also be asked to check these details are up-to-date every six months. If you move address or get a new contact number, please let us know the new details as soon as possible.

Noticeboard



There is a noticeboard at the entrance where up-to-date information is also posted. Feel free to take a photo of any signs or messages that appear on the noticeboard.

Online Learning Journals

A record of your child's experiences and progress will be kept using Online Learning Journals and we often send communication this way, so it is important we have your email address. These journals allow parents and carers to easily access and comment on their child's learning from home. The journals are username, password and PIN protected. Details of how to access these journals will be shared with you during the settling in process at nursery.

Settling Your Child

Children are introduced gradually over the course of several sessions. You will receive a letter from the school with a start date and time to arrive for the initial session.

If your child seems upset or reluctant to stay, please do not worry. The Nursery Team is very experienced in supporting children in these situations. All Nursery staff have a role to play in supporting your child's development in Nursery, however, each child will also be allocated a 'Key Worker' who will track the progress of your child during their time in nursery.



Suitable Clothing

Please dress your child in clothes which they can put on and take off easily. They will be painting, gluing and playing in water, sand and mud, so please make sure they don't come to nursery in their best clothes!

We are outdoors every day, and in all weathers, so it is important that your child comes to nursery with suitable outdoor clothing, including a pair of wellies, which should be kept on the racks in the cloakroom.

Drawstring bags will be provided for children to keep a full change of clothes (including underwear) in case of any accidents. These bags should stay on your child's peg in the cloakroom. They should also have a pair of indoor shoes for nursery in this bag.

Please clearly label all items of clothing and shoes with your child's name!



A morning and afternoon snack is offered during each nursery session. We aim to ensure that these snacks are healthy, and the children have an opportunity to suggest ideas for the snack menu. Please see the snack menu on the noticeboard each week to see what your child has been offered for snack. Please ensure staff aware of any changes to your child's dietary requirements or allergies.



A hot lunch is offered Monday to Thursday with a packed lunch offered on a Friday. The lunch menu for the week will be emailed, displayed on the nursery noticeboard and on Twitter.



Sun Awareness

On warm, sunny days please apply sun cream to your child before bringing them to nursery. We have sun cream in the nursery and we support the children with application throughout the day. We will provide sun hats to help children cover up but please ensure your child is wearing a top that covers their shoulders.



Children should avoid bringing their own toys into the nursery, as they may become lost or broken which can be upsetting for your child. We have plenty of toys for the children to engage with both indoors and outside. We understand that some children like to travel to nursery with a toy, but we ask that parents and carers take this home with them after they drop their child off.

Administration of Medication

If your child requires medication during the Nursery session, please inform a member of the nursery team who will ask you to complete the appropriate medication form.

Nursery Attendance

If your child is ever unwell, please contact the school (0131 336 3361) to make us aware of the reason for their absence.

Please inform the nursery team as soon as possible if your child has any illness or condition that may be infectious. This will enable the team to take the appropriate steps to reduce the risk of any infections spreading.

Children who have had diarrhoea or vomiting **must not** return to nursery until 48 hours after their last bout.

COVID-19

There is no longer any requirement to test for COVID-19. If your child has a fever or feels unwell thy should stay at home until they no longer have a temperature and until they feel better. If your child tests positive for COVID 19 they should stay at home for 3 days after they took the test of from the day their symptoms starts (whichever was earliest). In the event of your child becoming unwell during the nursery session you will be contacted by the school.

Preparing your child for nursery

At nursery, we encourage your child to develop their independence. Here are a few things you could do to help your child prepare for nursery.

- Is your child developing their ability to toilet themselves independently?
- Is your child dressed in clothes that are easy to pull up and down by themselves?
- Is your child able to put on and take off their own coat?
- Is your child able to put on and take off their own shoes and wellies?
- Is your child encouraged to tidy up toys once they have finished playing with them?
- Is your child encourage to share and take turns when they play with other children?

Not all children will be able to do all these things when they first start at nursery and our team are here to support your child whenever they require help.

Your Child's Learning

The nursery follows the Curriculum for Excellence which is designed to meet the needs of children across Nursery and Primary One. We have engaged with the 'Realising the Ambition' document to give staff practical guidance on the experiences and interactions necessary to deliver the learning journey for our young children, striving for good practice in creating a caring and nurturing setting that allows wellbeing, communication, curiosity, inquiry and creativity to flourish.

Children are actively engaged in learning through high-quality play opportunities. These opportunities are planned in response to the needs and interests of the children. Opportunities for children to make real choices and decisions are important. Literacy, Numeracy, Health and Wellbeing are embedded across all areas of the nursery.

We use large 'floor books' to allow the children to engage with the planning in our nursery. This enables them to draw and write their ideas and discuss what they want to learn about in small groups. These floor books will be available to view on a regular basis.



Our Nursery Garden



The children have 'free-flow play' during each nursery session. This means each child can choose whether to play indoors or outdoors and move freely from area to area depending on their own interests throughout the session. We are very fortunate to have a large and exciting nursery garden, and the team are continually developing this area.

Why is outdoor play so important?

The outdoors can provide space and freedom for a type of learning that is difficult to replicate indoors. All children and young people have the right to experience the unique and special nature of being outdoors. We feel it is important to enable children to access the outside environment as a context for learning throughout the year. Our Nursery Team support the children to make choices, test their skills and develop their learning indoors and outdoors.

Access to outdoor play

It is important for parents and carers to know that we are following best practice in the area of outdoor play and we would not restrict children's access to the outdoors unless specific special circumstances applied. We are sensitive to individual circumstances such as a child returning from illness, however, if you feel your child is not yet well enough to play outdoors then they are not yet well enough to return to nursery. Please feel free to speak to a member of the Nursery Team if you have any questions relating to this.

How can <u>you</u> help your child learn using the outdoor environment?



Please ensure that your child has warm and waterproof clothes for each daily nursery session – including appropriate footwear. Children often get dirty or muddy more often when playing and learning outdoors, so clothes that allow active movement and can be easily washed are advisable.



Be aware that children have access to the outdoors area all year round and in almost all weather conditions.

How can <u>we</u> help your child learn using the outdoor environment?



Our staff will provide a range of learning opportunities for children to ensure that outdoor play enables your child to be creative, active and develop communication and teamwork skills.



Staff will also support children in making choices to assess risk and learn about appropriate and safe behaviour. It is important for parents to know that the outdoor area is just as important a learning area as our indoor space – children will still have rules and supports in place at all times.



We provide splash suits for all children.

We aim to keep you up to date with your child's progress through the Online Learning Journals.

The noticeboard in the cloakroom displays information about events, planning and snacks.

A termly newsletter is produced, listing important dates, giving reminders and detailing what has been happening in the nursery.
